

**PAPAMOA PRIMARY SCHOOL (1885)**

**ENROLMENT SCHEME**

Effective from 30 May 2005  
(Amendment July 2018)



The guidelines for development and operating of enrolment schemes are issued under section 11G (3) of the Education Act 1989 for the purpose of describing the basis on which the Secretary's powers in relation to enrolment schemes will be exercised.

**Home Zone**

**All students who live within the home zone described below (and shown on the attached map) shall be entitled to enrol at the school.**

Starting from 734 Papamoa Beach Road, travel south-east along the shoreline to a point that is 800m past the eastern boundary of 13 Marjorie Lane.

From this point, travel south to the Bell Road Boat Ramp on the Kaituna River.

From the boat ramp, travel west to the intersection of Poplar Lane and the Te Puke Highway. All addresses on Poplar Lane are included in the zone. Addresses on the Te Puke Highway that are south of the intersection with Poplar Lane are excluded from the zone.

From the end of Poplar Lane, travel south-west to capture 502 Reid Road.

Capture 530 Reid Road, then cross Reid Road to capture all of 486 Reid Road. From the western boundary of 486 Reid Road, travel north to capture 892 Welcome Bay Road. Addresses on Rocky Cutting Road are excluded from the zone.

From 892 Welcome Bay Road, cross the road to capture 879 Welcome Bay Road, then travel west along Welcome Bay Road to the eastern boundary of Te Kura Kaupapa Maori o Otepou. This Kura is excluded from the zone, as is 791 Welcome Bay Road.

The boundary then travels northwards to meet SH2 (opposite the entrance to Bruce Road), and capturing addresses on Kairua Road.

The boundary travels south-east along SH2, capturing even-numbered addresses only, to the roundabout where SH2, Domain Road and the Te Puke Highway meet.

From this roundabout the boundary travels east through the Domain Road/Tara Road roundabout, and along Tara Road, capturing odd numbered addresses on Tara Road only. The boundary crosses Tara Road where Tara Road intersects with Obsidian Way.

The boundary captures travels north around addresses 114 A-E Tara Road, and then travels directly east to the rear of 20 Blanche Road. The boundary travels north along the rear of addresses on Blanche Road, the intersection of Longview Drive. The boundary then travels north along Longview

Drive, capturing addresses on both sides of the road, to the intersection of Longview Drive and Dickson Road.

The boundary captures 175 Dickson Road, then travels north to 734 Papamoa Beach Road.

### Out of Zone Enrolments

Each year the Board of Trustees will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The Board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolments will be processed in the following order of priority:

- **First priority** must be given to students who have been accepted for enrolment in the following special programme(s) run by the school and approved by the Secretary for Education.
- **Second priority** must be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.
- **Third priority** must be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.
- **Fourth priority** must be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.
- **Fifth priority** must be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school.
- **Sixth priority** must be given to all other applicants.

### Special Programmes

The School does not operate a special programme.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, or fifth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions by the Secretary. Under Section 11G (1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
